School Car free Zone update

Our Community Police were present during the week following concerns expressed to them from parents and residents about the number of vehicles not observing the School Car Free Zone. They have asked us to remind parents that driving through the SCFZ during the restricted periods can lead to a fine. This SCFZ pilot been in place since last year and GCC would like to get feedback about the scheme from parents and carers. The survey is online and started on the 19th of April and run for 4 weeks until the 16th of May.
