
We will also speak to the children about keeping safe online at assemblies and in class in school.

There are still a small number of children attending school with these watches. These devices are not appropriate for use in school, as similar to mobile phones; these watches can take pictures and/or record/film/facetime/video call etc. In addition we are not insured for any damages that may occur.

Please also note that energy drinks, chewing gum or lollipops are not appropriate to be brought into school for snacks.

Parking Buddies

We have pleaded with our school community over the last 5 years to support us with our parking arrangements in order to keep the school and the surrounding streets as safe as possible. We would like to extend a huge thanks to our Parent Council who managed to source funding for the purchase of Parking Buddies to remind parents of the School Car free zone campaign which has now been labelled 'Safer Streets'. Our JRSO team spent time assembling them during the week and we have been using



them to remind everyone of the importance of not parking within this zone. Please continue to support us with this as there has been an increase in the number of cars parking on the path outside the school over the last few weeks and the Community Police will issue tickets to any unauthorised vehicle parked in this area.

Parking in and around the School

I have been contacted again by neighbours of the school to ask that parents DO NOT PARK ACROSS DRIVEWAYS near the school. It is imperative that we have good relations with our neighbours in the community and consideration of their necessity to access their properties would be much appreciated.

Road Safety and Parking on Crompton Avenue/Safe Streets Campaign Reminder

A reminder that it is not permitted to drive down Crompton Avenue between 8.30-9.15am and 2.45-3.30pm as the school is part of a school free car zone scheme run by GCC. This has been in place since session 2019-2020. Please note that the Community Police have been issuing tickets throughout last session and will continue to support the school by reminding the public of the restrictions that are still in place and must be obeyed.

Car Park

Please do not use the school car park at any time for dropping off your child including breakfast club and after school (Exemptions for blue badge holders). Parents/carers and children must also use pedestrian areas only when accessing the school grounds. As I highlighted on other Newsletters there are other City Building staff who drive through the main gate from 8am and will be unaware that parents have been incorrectly using this gate as a pedestrian walkway. This could have serious repercussions and result in an accident.
